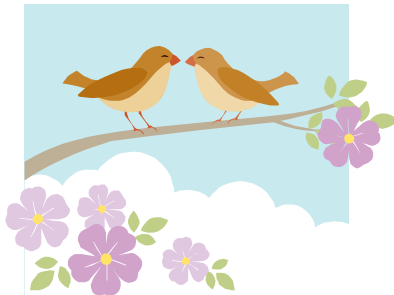

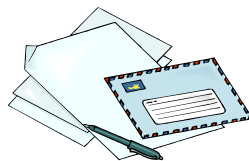

Secretary's Report

Minutes March 17, 2012

Fred opened the meeting at approximately 1: 40 pm. Attendance was poor probably on account of rainy weather. First on the agenda was David's request for suggestions for birds he would procure for the 2013 breeding program. He explained that he needed commitments from breeders asap this year in order for " best stock" choices. After a lengthy discussion the following birds were suggested by the group with the understanding that the club needed to spend at least \$100 per bird for suitable stock.

Roller-----The club should try another round, this time with better stock possibly from Linda Hogan.

Parisian Frill----David noted that a good bird was going to cost at least \$300 and therefore, not a good option.

Stafford-----This was a good choice considering cost, availability and breeding success.

Lizard-----There were two choices for Lizards, Australian and American. Australian more brilliant but not recognized by judges.

Scotch Fancy-- These were hard to locate but still a good option.

Mosaic----- Feather lump problem made these birds a poor choice.

Agate-----This was a good choice considering cost, availability and breeding success.

New Color----- (defined as mutation of classic color- bred) good option also, per David

Secondly, David reminded everyone that website should include information about individual members to include general address, short biography, birds kept (non- canaries also) bred and/or available for sale. If prizes earned at shows, this would also should be noted.

The club had decided previously that individual member information would



be a selling point to draw new members.

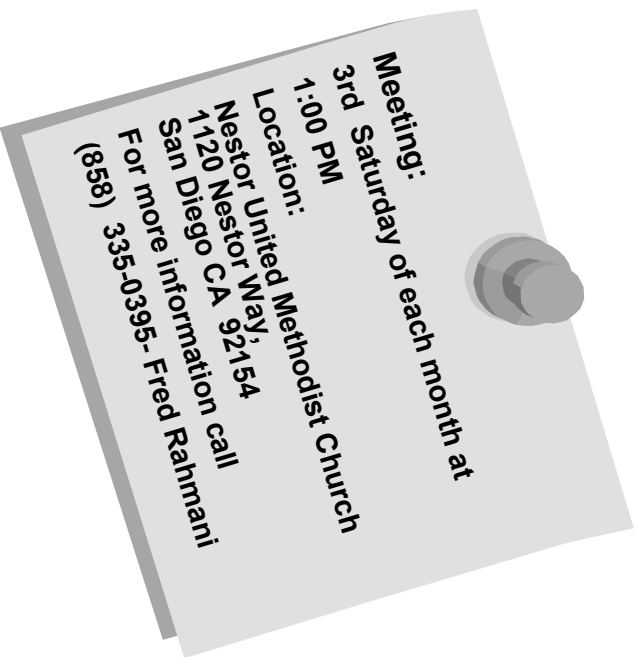
